HOW TO COMPLETE THE SURVEY

1. Ensure your web browser is pointing to:

2. Click 'Take Survey Now'.
3. Read the participant information.
4. If you wish to participate, click 'Next'.
5. The survey will take 20 to 30 minutes to complete.
6. To select your answer, click a button or select an answer from the drop-down menu. You may also be asked to type in your answer for some questions.
7. To submit your survey, click 'Submit' on the final page.
8. At the end of the survey you will see a link to the iPad competition. If you wish to take part you will be asked to enter your name and address. This data will be stored separately to your survey answers.
9. Competition winners will be informed by May 1st 2015.
