The basics Hepatitis C treatment



We recommend that you discuss the information in this leaflet with a doctor or other health worker.

Hepatitis C treatment has improved rapidly in recent years.



More than 95% of people who take treatment are cured of hepatitis C. In other words, they no longer have the virus.

Treatment **works just as well** for people living with HIV as for other people.



Treatment typically lasts **two or three months.**



Treatment usually involves taking tablets once or twice a day. **There aren't any injections.**

Most people don't have any side effects.

A few people feel a little tired, feel sick, have diarrhoea or have headaches. Most people can carry on with their jobs and their usual activities while they take treatment.

Important points

Modern hepatitis C treatment is simple to take and has few side effects.

Successful treatment clears the hepatitis C virus from your body.
